Proposal to increase the permanent capacity of All Saints CEVA Primary School, Wellingborough
Northamptonshire County Council is proposing to increase the capacity of All Saints Church of England Voluntary Aided (CEVA) Primary School, Castle Street, Wellingborough, Northamptonshire, NN8 1LS. The proposed change would see the school expand from a 1 form entry school with a published admissions number (PAN) of 30 and capacity for 210 pupils, to a two form entry school with a PAN of 60, and capacity for 420 pupils.

As the current school site is constrained, in order to accommodate the additional pupils, the county council is proposing to develop a second site on Croyland Road, which will operate as an annex to the existing school.

If approved, the additional capacity would be introduced in a phased way, responding to demand for school places in the area.

This expansion is being proposed in order to ensure that rapidly increasing demand for primary school places in Wellingborough can be met. Demand for primary school places has been stimulated by a rising birth rate, new housing developments and sustained in-migration into the borough.
