What is the consultation title?\*

Proposed amalgamation of Whitefriars Infant and Junior Schools, Rushden

What is this consultation about?\*

In partnership with the governing bodies of Whitefriars Infant School and Whitefriars Junior School, Northamptonshire County Council is proposing to merge the two schools to create a 4-11 primary school. Subject to consultation and approval, it is anticipated that a single primary school would begin to operate from September 2017.

There are a variety of reasons underlying this proposals, and It is felt that a merger would:

- Create a seamless transition from Key Stage 1 (infant phase) to Key Stage 2 (junior phase)
- Allow children on roll at the school to benefit from a potentially wider range of resources and improved staff development
- Help to facilitate more consistent and established relationships between pupils, parents and the school, allowing the school to better understand pupil needs
- Provide more development opportunities for staff, through shared training and the chance to work across key stages
- Strengthen and develop the already positive, established links between the school and the local community.
