Superfast Northamptonshire - State Aid

The Superfast Northamptonshire project is helping to deliver the ambitious target set by Northamptonshire County Council to see superfast broadband available countywide by the end of 2017.

As part of this process, this consultation seeks views from interested stakeholders (specifically, broadband infrastructure providers, internet service providers, the general public and businesses) on the proposed 'Intervention Area' for the investment of public funds to extend Next Generation Access. Next Generation Access (NGA) networks are wired networks which are capable of delivering broadband services with higher speeds, as compared to those provided over already existing copper networks.

To do this, the county council will need to identify and address 'White areas': areas of the county where a superfast broadband service does not exist and where there is no coverage planned.

As part of the background work informing this consultation, the county council also recently completed an Open Market Review whereby telecoms providers were invited to confirm their existing and planned NGA commercial coverage. This information has been aggregated as described in the public consultation and shown on the Basic Broadband and NGA maps (please use the links at the bottom of this page for further information about this process and/or to see the maps).
