Corby Northern Orbital Road

Target Notes

- 1 Semi-improved grassland with scattered scrub. Suitable for reptiles and previous reptile/amphibian fence still remaining from PAA work but in a state of disrepair.
- 3 Old ash tree with suitable voids and crevices to provide a bat roosting site.
- 4 Mammal tracks, possibly badger, fox or deer.
- 5 Rubble pile – suitable hibernation habitat for amphibians and reptiles.
- 6 Semi-improved grassland has been stripped to leave bare ground with some species of disturbed grasslands such as scentless mayweed and bristly oxtongue.
- 7 Disused balancing ponds suitable for GCN
- 8 Large boulder and log piles – suitable hibernacula for reptiles and amphibians
- 9 Log pile - hibernacula for reptiles and amphibians
- 10 Area of woodland containing hawthorn. Ash, elder.
- 11 Old willow tree with suitable voids for a bat roost.
- 13 Badger latrine
- 15 Large lake which has had a history of pollution. No fish seen and thought not to be used by locals as a fishing area due to the pollution in the past.
- 16 Dry pond.
- 17 Land of semi-improved grassland owned by Wilson Bowden Developments for the development of an industrial area and distribution park.
