<u>QUERY/ISSUE/OBSERVATIONS</u>			
<p>Jonathan Tye was instructed by GP Planning to undertake an assessment for protected species within a 55m section of hedgerow:</p> <p>Badgers</p> <p>The hedgerow was assessed for the presence of badgers or their setts. No evidence of badger activity was observed or noted during the surveys.</p> <p>Bats</p> <p>No mature trees were present that could offer any form of roosting potential for bats. No evidence of bats or roosting sites was observed during the assessment.</p> <p>Nesting Birds</p> <p>The hedgerow had recently been topped therefore offered limited nesting opportunities for birds. No nesting birds or active birds' nests were discovered during the inspection.</p> <p>Reptiles/Amphibians</p> <p>The majority of the hedgerow bottom consisted of bare ground with some small patches of ruderal; vegetation, these patches offered no sheltering or foraging opportunities for reptiles or amphibians. No reptiles or amphibians were observed during this inspection.</p>
